
Brothers and sisters,

Once moved into the parsonage, we were immediately greeted with sub-freezing temperatures, snow, and ice. Snowed in and quarantined, I thought a lot about the church body as a place of community and about our need for each other. As you well know, faith in Jesus was never designed to be a faith of isolation, whether that isolation is voluntary or not. Meeting together corporately is an essential part of life in Christ. The gathered, unified, praying, worshipping church is one of the ways that God shows off who He is to the world around us. So too is obedience to the instructions to "bear one another's burdens", "love one another", "confess your sins to one another", and the more than 40 other "one another" commands to the church listed in the New Testament. Corporate worship and community are not limited to Sunday morning services, they are a daily practice as well. But too often, we are too comfortable living apart from each other. Too often, we are too comfortable living as spiritual hermits, detached from the struggles and victories of one another. It is a call to know the believers that God has placed in your life and to be known by them. A call to do the hard work of being vulnerable and honest, so that God can minister through you and to you. I believe that as we faithfully follow Jesus together, He will bless our church beyond what we can imagine right now.
